CCA withdrawal motion unsuccessful

The Cradle Coast Authority (CCA) is pleased that a motion to have Burnie City Council withdraw from the alliance was unsuccessful at tonight's Council's Meeting. The motion was lost 7/2.

CCA is owned by the nine Councils of western and north-western Tasmania to help them achieve regional outcomes and maintain strong local government, by working together.

CCA is delivering an impressive list of current projects with and for our Member Councils and funding partners and is making very good progress towards a number of ambitious long term plans. Tangible results of our current work include people gaining employment, Coastal Pathway improvements, reduced soil erosion, improved habitat for threatened species, and small businesses being supported through start-up and COVID-19 recovery, to name a few.

All of our work aligns with the Annual Plans, budgets and long term plans endorsed by our Member Councils.

Quarterly Representatives' Meetings, Council representation on our Board and CCA participation in Council Workshops and General Managers' Meetings provide avenues for Councillors either directly or indirectly, to inform, shape, endorse or reject what CCA does and how we do it.

Any proposal for a major change in the way that Councils work together through CCA must be raised by, discussed among and agree to by, our region's Mayors and General Managers.

We thank Burnie City Councillors for their continued support and look forward to working with them to do even more good work, together.
