Chief Representative echoes Premier's calls for vigilance

Cradle Coast Authority (CCA) Chief Representative, Mayor Jan Bonde, has echoed Premier Gutwein's calls for people to remain vigilant and stay at home, especially during the Easter period.

"Social distancing will be even more difficult during Easter, a time when we traditionally gather with friends and family to share joy and laughter. This Easter however and in the weeks ahead, everybody must stay home" said Mayor Bonde.
